

ACCOUNTABILITY FOR EVIDENCE-BASED HEALTH & WELLNESS POLICIES in the 2017 New Hampshire Legislative Session

New Futures is a nonpartisan, nonprofit organization committed to improving the health and wellness of all New Hampshire residents. Since its inception in 1997, New Futures has shaped the changing alcohol and other drug policy landscape in New Hampshire. In 2017, through funding from the Endowment for Health, the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation, and the HNH Foundation, New Futures expanded its advocacy focus to general health and early childhood policy, in addition to its continued work at the forefront of substance use policy. As part of the expansion, New Futures also took on a new initiative: New Futures Kids Count, funded through the Annie E. Casey Foundation.

With an expanded mission and vision, New Futures' policy portfolio has grown substantially. In the 2017 legislative session, New Futures tracked 113 bills, a sampling of which are reflected in this legislative scorecard. In reviewing the activity of this legislative session, it is important to note that a significant majority of House and Senate bills were determined through voice vote, where an individual legislator's vote is not recorded. However, at other times, both the House and Senate have the ability to record the vote of each legislator on a bill through the roll call process. This report tracks 8 roll call votes in the Senate and 7 roll call votes in the House during the 2017 legislative session. These bills represent some of the key substance use, mental health, early childhood, and health policy issues that present challenges and opportunities for growth within our state.

New Hampshire has seen its drug and alcohol problems reach epic proportions within the last few years. In 2016, [479 people died from drug overdoses](#),¹ and first responders across the state administered life-saving Narcan [2,895 times](#).² However, drug overdoses are just one indicator of the substance misuse epidemic we are facing. The ripple effects of this crisis must also be measured and addressed. We know that approximately 110,468 New Hampshire residents have a diagnosable substance use disorder³ and that substance misuse costs New Hampshire businesses [\\$2.3 billion per year](#) in lost worker productivity, health care, public safety, and other expenses.⁴ We also know that the substance use crisis impacts youth and those caring for them. Child care providers, school districts, healthcare providers, and youth-serving nonprofits across the state repeatedly report seeing signs of toxic stress in children ages 0-18, often caused by drug and alcohol use in families⁵. Mental health and substance use providers repeatedly report that drug and alcohol use amongst adults is linked to past childhood trauma⁶. Additionally, 10,000 grandparents in New Hampshire have stepped up to care for their

grandchildren, most frequently because of substance use concerns.⁷ The scale of this crisis leaves few residents of our state untouched.

New Futures envisions a State and local communities whose public policies support the health and wellness of all New Hampshire residents.

To achieve this vision, it is imperative that New Hampshire voters have clear and accurate information on how their representatives voted on crucial health and wellness policy.

ALCOHOL AND OTHER DRUG POLICY

SB 196: Relative to liquor revenues deposited into the alcohol abuse prevention and treatment fund.

New Futures supported SB 196 because legislation intended to restore the amount of gross profits from the sale of alcohol in the state to be allocated into to the Alcohol Abuse Prevention and Treatment Fund, otherwise known as the Alcohol Fund, to the legislatively intended 5% formula. The Alcohol Fund supports substance use disorder prevention, treatment, and recovery programs and services that have been historically underfunded. The Senate amended SB 196 to allocate 3.4% of gross profits, an increase from the current 1.7% allocation. The full Senate passed the bill 24-0, but it was later laid on the table and did not pass. However, the finalized budget bills, HB 144 and HB 517, also included language to increase funding to 3.4% of gross profits.

SB 233: Relative to the legalization and regulation of marijuana and establishing a committee to study the legalization of marijuana.

New Futures opposed SB 233, because of the grave implications to our youth, negative impacts to public health and public safety, and threat to New Hampshire's quality of life. Moving forward with legislation to legalize retail marijuana would mean that all components of the marijuana business process, including marketing and advertising, would be legal in our state. This type of legislation would enable and promote the development of a commercial marijuana enterprise similar to Big Tobacco. This enterprise would include an active network of growers, manufacturers, distributors, and retail establishments with high potency marijuana based oils and edible products such as marijuana infused candy and baked goods. SB 233 failed in the Senate and did not become law.

Failed the Senate [Senate Vote #66], (OTPA 19-4)

SB 234: Relative to hypodermic syringes and needles containing residual amounts of controlled drugs and authorizing the operation of syringe service programs in New Hampshire.

New Futures supported SB 234 because it allowed for the creation of state-based syringe service programs. This bill was the legislative outcome of the Study Commission on Hypodermic Syringes and Needles. SB 234 allowed for the creation of state-based syringe service programs. At the time this bill was passed, New Hampshire was the only New England state without such a program. Unlike a straight needle exchange, syringe service programs include screening for infectious disease, access to information, and connection to resources when an individual decides they are ready to ask for help. This real-time access to treatment is critical to helping individuals find a path to recovery. SB 234 passed both the House and Senate and was signed into law by Governor Sununu.

HB 160: Relative to qualifying medical conditions for the therapeutic use of cannabis and relative to registry identification cards.

New Futures opposed HB 160, which added Ehlers-Danlos syndrome, chronic pain, and post-traumatic stress disorder to the list of qualifying medical conditions for the purposes of use of therapeutic cannabis, due to the lack of review and appropriate research by the Therapeutic Cannabis Advisory Council. This Council is the body designated by law and tasked with reviewing outcomes for qualifying medical conditions and the efficacy of therapeutic cannabis program. House Bill 160 passed both the House and Senate and was signed into law by Governor Sununu.

EARLY CHILDHOOD POLICY

SB 191: Establishing Keno and relative to funding for kindergarten.

New Futures supported SB 191 because it proposed to increase state funds to school districts for full-day kindergarten programs. Full-day kindergarten provides children a strong start and equal opportunity to succeed. Studies have shown that quality early education programs like full-day kindergarten can mitigate the effects of adverse childhood experiences and help prevent future substance misuse. SB 191 was adopted by both the House and Senate through the Committee of Conference report and signed into law by Governor Sununu.

SB 247: Preventing childhood lead poisoning from paint and water and making an appropriation to a special fund.

New Futures supported SB 247 because the bill would have provided additional protections to children from avoidable lead poisoning. As introduced, SB 247 increased lead screenings for children, established a public fund to help address lead hazards from lead-based paint and from drinking water, and created provisions to ensure safe drinking water in schools and day care facilities. SB 247 passed the Senate but was retained by the House Finance Committee.

HB 370: Making an appropriation for the purpose of meeting new federal regulations relative to child care.

New Futures supported HB 370 because it increased investments in the child care scholarship in order to meet new federal regulations to maintain the program. Investment and intervention in early childhood, particularly access to quality child care, can dramatically alter a child's life trajectory in a positive way. Enrollment in quality early education has substantial positive impacts on children and their families including, but not limited to, increased health and quality of life, reduced drug use later in life, enhanced future income, reduced crime rates, increased education, and increased family incomes. Early intervention not only helps to combat toxic stress, but also provides long term health, wellness, and financial benefits to the child, the family and the state. Even though HB 370 failed the House and did not become law, increased funding for the child care scholarship program was ultimately included in the budget bills, HB 144 and HB 517, which were adopted by both the Senate and House.

Failed the House [House Vote #74] (ITL 168-166)

HB 629: Establishing a preference for the appointment of the child's grandparent as the guardian of the minor in certain cases and making an appropriation to the Department of Health and Human Services.

New Futures supported HB 629 because it sought to provide a preference for grandparents seeking guardianship of their grandchildren due to parental substance misuse. HB 629 supports the rapidly growing number of grandparents raising their grandchildren due to the opioid epidemic. Parental substance misuse is a known contributor of toxic stress in a child's life. Children who experience multiple adverse situations in early life are at a substantially greater risk for physical and mental health issues. Often grandparents are the greatest source of stability for these children in crisis. HB 629 aimed to help enable grandparents to seek formal guardianship thus improving the health and wellness outcomes of the children of the opioid epidemic. HB 629 was passed by both the House and Senate and signed into law by Governor Sununu.

HEALTHCARE POLICY

SB 54: Relative to the licensure of alcohol and drug counselors, requiring occupational regulatory boards and commissions to post reciprocity information, and establishing a committee to study licensure of alcohol and drug counselors.

New Futures supported SB 54 because it removed significant barriers to reciprocity for out-of-state substance use disorder providers. Given New Hampshire's need to attract qualified clinicians in the addiction treatment field, ensuring the ability of out-of-state licensees to easily transfer their license to New Hampshire is of the utmost importance. SB 54 compelled state compliance with national licensing standards; allowed for preliminary licensure of out-of-state professionals whose applications were not decided upon by the licensing board within 60 days; required conspicuous posting of reciprocity criteria by the licensing board; and, established a committee to study the licensure of drug and alcohol counselors. SB 54 passed both the House and Senate and was signed into law by Governor Sununu.

HB 250: Establishing a committee to consider revisions to the New Hampshire health insurance laws.

New Futures supported HB 250 because evaluating the potential for a publicly-funded health insurance program would be an initial step in making sure all Granite Staters have access to timely, affordable, and quality health care. HB 250, as introduced, sought to establish a commission to study developing a "health care for all" program. The House amended and incorporated two other bills, HB 321 (establishing a commission to study a public option for health insurance) and HB 611 (regarding insurance rates in the event of an ACA repeal); thus creating a committee to evaluate New Hampshire's insurance laws regarding rates and a comprehensive public option for all residents. HB 250 as amended passed the House on a voice vote, but was voted down in the Senate and did not become law.

STATE BUDGET

HB 144: Making appropriations for the expenses of certain departments of the State for fiscal years ending June 30, 2018 and June 30, 2019.

HB 517: Relative to state fees, funds, revenues, and expenditures.

HB 144 and HB 517 were the '18/'19 state operating budget bills. New Futures supported the Committee of Conference proposed budget because of increased resources in the following areas:

- Funding Substance Use Disorder Prevention, Treatment and Recovery:
 - The Alcohol Abuse Prevention and Treatment Fund, otherwise known as the Alcohol Fund, was increased from 1.7% to 3.4% of gross profits from alcohol sales in the proposed state budget. The Alcohol Fund supports substance use disorder prevention, treatment, and recovery programs and services that have been historically underfunded.
- Child Care:
 - An additional \$15 million for child care scholarships was included in the state budget to meet new federal program requirements. The increase in funding ensures continued access for New Hampshire's children and families to affordable child care. Investing in early development opportunities like quality child care is a vital and proactive way to support children and families, reduce state costs, and prevent future substance misuse.
- Children's Mental Health:
 - The state budget included funding for children's wraparound health services, access to mobile crisis centers, and other necessary paths to ensure children's access to mental health supports. Investment in children's mental health is not only crucial for individual children and families; it also improves the state's economy as a whole.

Both bills were adopted by both the House and Senate in the Committee of Conference report and signed into law by Governor Sununu.
