

Children’s Behavioral Health Policy Advisory Committee: Application Scoring Rubric

Points	<p>Criterion 1: Connection and Commitment to Children’s Behavioral Health Field (20 points)</p> <p><i>For this criterion, applicants have the opportunity to demonstrate their connection and commitment to the children’s behavioral health field through:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Their lived experience as a youth/family member</i> • <i>Professional experience as a provider of services for children, youth and their families with mental health and substance use disorders</i> • <i>Professional experience in a public child-serving system (e.g. juvenile justice, child protection, community mental health, public health)</i> • <i>Volunteer and leadership opportunities with the CBHC or other organizations advocating for change in the children’s behavioral health field.</i> • <i>Their hopes and dreams for the systems that serve children and youth with mental health and substance use disorders and their families.</i>
15-20	<p>The applicant convincingly demonstrates their connection and commitment to the children’s behavioral health field through:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A clearly stated connection as a youth/family member with lived experience especially within public child-serving systems; • Relevant professional experience working with children, youth and their families and/or one or more public child-serving systems; • Volunteer and/or leadership opportunities in which they have been involved; • Specific and aspirational hopes and dreams for the systems that serve children and youth with mental health and substance use disorders and their families
6-14	<p>The applicant somewhat demonstrates their connection and commitment to the children’s behavioral health field through:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A connection as a youth/family member with lived experience • Some previous professional or volunteer experience working with children and youth impacted by mental health and substance use disorders • Providing general aspirational hopes for public child-serving systems
0-5	<p>The applicant minimally demonstrates their connection and commitment to the children’s behavioral health field through:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Providing general details about their experiences with and observations of the systems that serve children with mental health and substance use disorders and their families.

Points	<p>Criterion 2: Alignment with System of Care Values and Principles (20 points)</p> <p><i>For this criterion, applicants have the opportunity to demonstrate their alignment with the CBHC’s System of Care values and principles through:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Their understanding of a System of Care approach and Core Values</i> • <i>Their own unique perspectives that they will bring to the Children’s Behavioral Health Policy Advisory Committee</i> • <i>An understanding of the CBHC work or process to date</i>
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15-20	<p>The applicant convincingly demonstrates their alignment with System of Care values and principles.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The applicant directly connects interest in participating in the children’s behavioral health policy advisory committee with system of care values and principles • Unique perspectives add diversity to the Children’s Behavioral Health Policy Advisory Committee • The applicant provides experiences during which they’ve participated in the CBHC, or knows about the work that has already taken place
6-14	<p>The applicant somewhat demonstrates their alignment with System of Care values and principles.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The applicant references system of care values and principles in their application. • The applicant identifies their unique perspectives, which may not directly align with the System of Care values and principles.
0-5	<p>The applicant minimally demonstrates their alignment with System of Care values and principles.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The applicant did not reference any of the System of Care values and principles in their application.

Points	<p>Criterion 3: Willingness and Ability to Contribute to the Children’s Behavioral Health Policy Advisory Committee (20 points)</p> <p><i>For this criteria, applicants have the opportunity to demonstrate their willingness and ability to contribute to the Children’s Behavioral Health Policy Advisory Committee through:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Volunteer or professional experiences advocating for legislative and public policy changes and/or interest in systems change</i> • <i>Their availability for the in-person meetings of the Children’s Behavioral Health Policy Advisory Committee</i> • <i>Their own unique perspectives they bring to the Children’s Behavioral Health Policy Advisory Committee</i>
15-20	<p>The applicant convincingly demonstrates they are willing and able to contribute to the Children’s Behavioral Health Policy Advisory Committee.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The applicant describes previous volunteer or professional experience advocating for legislative and public policy changes • The applicant is readily available to participate in the in-person meetings of the Children’s Behavioral Health Policy Advisory Committee. • The applicant clearly specifies their unique perspectives, which they are eager to contribute to the Children’s Behavioral Health Policy Advisory Committee.
6-14	<p>The applicant somewhat demonstrates they are willing and able to contribute to the Children’s Behavioral Health Policy Advisory Committee.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Though the applicant does not demonstrate previous experience advocating for legislative and public policy change, interest in systems change and additional experience is clearly stated.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The applicant is mostly available to participate in the in-person meetings of the Children’s Behavioral Health Policy Advisory Committee• The applicant can identify their unique perspectives, but may not connect them with the work of the Children’s Behavioral Health Policy Advisory Committee
0-5	<p>The applicant minimally demonstrates they are willing and able to contribute to the Children’s Behavioral Health Policy Advisory Committee.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The applicant has no experience or expressed interest in legislative or public policy changes• The applicant does not appear to be available for in-person meetings of the Children’s Behavioral Health Policy Advisory Committee
